

What is on the Boat

AM/FM player with Blue tooth or an auxiliary input jack, lifejackets, life ring and rope, fire extinguishers, map of the lake, tie-down ropes, tie-down augers for the beach, propane barbeque, pressurized hot and cold water system and forced air furnace, 12 & 16 sleepers have a TV that is hooked up to a DVD player.

All of the boats are equipped with Honda generators for 110 power. The 12 and 16 sleepers are equipped with Invertors to provide 110 power when the generator is not running.

10 gallons of drinking water are supplied. However, some of our guests bring flats of 500 ml bottles and thus put their names on them.

Cleaning supplies are provided

All of our cleaning supplies that we provide are Green! For example, hand soap, dish soap, all-purpose cleaning product, a bottle of degreaser and window cleaner! Plus we also supply a few cleaning rags under the sinks in the kitchen and in the bathroom(s), so that you can tidy as you go and for your use on your return day to get ready for our walk through on your return to our docks on your last day. Brooms, one for inside and outside, dust pan, mops, one for inside and one for outside, mop pail and ringer for inside and outside, shop vacuum, toilet brush. One garbage bag for each day of your trip, two rolls of toilet paper for each day of your trip, one roll of paper towel roll is provided.

What to Bring in General

You will need a cell phone compatible with SaskTel, food, beverages, pillows, sheet sets and blankets or sleeping bags, (whichever you prefer), bath towels, face cloths, hand towels, bath mat or floor towel, tea towels and dish cloths, camera, binoculars, flashlight, first aid kit, compact discs, fishing gear, beach chairs for on the top deck of the houseboat and for the beach, cards and games, insect repellent, sunscreen, hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes.

What to bring for the Bathroom

- Bath towels for showering and for the beach.
- Face cloths.
- Hand towels.
- Bath mat or towel for the floor so when you step out of the shower no one slips.
- Personal toiletries.

What to bring for bedding on the 8 sleeper

- There are 3 couches that pull out to make into a "double" ** size bed. (52x69, 52x73, 54x70 inches.)
- The kitchen table folds down to make into a "double" ** size bed. (59x68 inches)
 ** Smaller than a double size mattress.

What to bring for bedding on the 10 sleeper

- There are two couches that pull out to make into a "double" ** size bed. (Back bedroom 50x70 inches, front room 52x73 inches)
 ** Smaller than a double size mattress.
- The kitchen table folds down to make into a "queen" * size bed.
 (53x84 inches)
 * Smaller than a queen size mattress.
- In the loft there is a double size mattress.
- In the little bedroom there is one set of twin size bunk beds.

To get to the loft there is a ladder attached to the wall and you climb up to your bed. Your head first, then shoulders, and then you crawl into bed. The height is approximately 3 feet tall only so you can't stand up once in the loft. We recommend the loft for those that are good with smaller spaces and for those that have good knees.

The loft has 3 large windows and 2 of the 3 open.

What to bring for bedding on the 12 sleeper

- There are 4 bedrooms and each mattress is a double in size.
- The kitchen table folds down to make into a double size bed. (52x77 inches)
- There is a sofa bed that folds out to make into a double size bed. The mattress is a memory foam mattress.

What to bring for bedding on the 16 sleeper

- All six bedrooms have solid doors for privacy.
- There are 6 bedrooms and each one has a double size mattress.
- There are also window(s) that open and a fan in each bedroom
- The kitchen table folds down to make into a double size bed. (56x75 inches.)
- There is a sofa bed that folds out to make into a double size bed. The mattress is a memory foam mattress.
- The two back (stern) main floor bedrooms are designed as regular bedrooms with storage and drawers under the bed.
- The third bedroom on the main floor is a raised bed with two steps to get into it.
- The fourth main floor bedroom is closest to the kitchen and has to be accessed on your knees. You can't stand up in this room as it is approximately 3 feet high. Suitable for children of all ages and adult size guests but you have to access it on your knees. Important to note, no one can stand up in this room.
- The fifth and sixth bedroom cubbies are accessed by stairs between the third bedroom and starboard stern main floor bedroom. At the top of the stairs there is a landing and the rooms are opposite of each other and are approximately 3 feet high so they have to be accessed on your knees. These rooms have two small windows that open along with a fan.

In the Kitchen

The Kitchen is an important part of the boat.

We want you to feel confident that you are getting properly handled kitchen inventory so to ensure this we can only guarantee this at an additional cost. Please let us know if you would like us to partially or completely stock your kitchen! Choose a package which fits your needs and let us know prior to your arrival so we can have your boat stocked.

What is supplied at no additional cost.

- All pots and lids.
- Frying pans, one is cast iron
- Cookie sheet
- Knife block with multiple assorted sharp knives including steak knives. For example, 16 steak knives on the 16 sleeper.
- Cutting board
- Barbeque Utensils: fork, flipper, tongs and wooden barbeque cleaning tool.
- Coffee pot and filters
- Microwave and microwave cover.
- o Toaster
- Tea pot and kettle.
- Barbeque lighter
- Trivets

What to bring for the Kitchen

- Tea towels & dish cloths. It's important to bring enough for all the days you are here as you will be charged extra if we need to wash your dishes.
- Food and drinks
- Salt & pepper and other spices, tin foil, plastic wrap, zip lock bags for left overs or opened food.

Some suggestions

Some of our guests have brought paper plates, plastic cutlery and glasses and even disposable foil ware for barbeque cooking.

Why? Due to the fact that there isn't a dishwasher someone is always doing dishes (3 times a day) and thus disposable is brought.

Kitchen items that can be supplied at an additional cost:

A completely stocked kitchen would include:

- 4 Tea towels (for a full week charter 8 tea towels)
- 2 Dish cloths (for a full week charter 4 dish cloths)
